The school would like to both thank these colleagues for their dedicated support over many years and wish them every success into the future. Thank you.

Rewards and Consequences: At the start of every school year we encouraged all our pupils to attend every day, give their very best and get fully involved in the life of the school. Those pupils who do this get recognised in many ways and it has been super to hear that over 1000 of our 1550 pupils are now involved in rewards trips and visits before the summer break. Very well done!

Unfortunately, as every school has to, we do have to deal with pupil behaviours that are not acceptable or that fall below the standards we expect. The ultimate sanction is exclusion from school and I have provided the school's exclusion figures for the last two years. Whilst we are a large 11-16 school our actual exclusion figures for fixed-term exclusions are well below those of other schools, nationally:

The number of FTE for 2017-18 has been influenced by repeat behaviours by a small number of pupils who were later permanently excluded.

The school has excluded pupils permanently for the possession of drugs, violent behaviour, criminal damage and disturbing the learning in lessons (repeated) of other pupils. Whilst this is always a difficult decision it is done in order to maintain high standards and ensure all involved in the life of the school, pupils and staff, can go about their business in a safe and calm learning environment.

Pupil News: Very well done to all the pupils who attended the Big Bang STEM event at Doncaster Racecourse. Mr McMonagle described their attitude and behaviour as 'brilliant!'.

Athletics: We have seen some super results in this year's Wakefield State Schools' Championships. We had 8 teams competing and saw our Year 7 boys' and girls' teams along with our Year 8 girls winning their respective competitions. Overall, the girls' teams from Kettlethorpe High School won their combined competition and the boys were third overall. Impressive, and the teams also beat teams from QEGs and WGHS. Very well done!

A special mention here to Amy Hunt, in Year 8, who has been selected to represent West Yorkshire at the English school's track and field championships at Birmingham in July. She is one of a team of 40. Enjoy the event Amy!

Music: Well done to our school band 'The Basement' who played this week at the Wakefield 'Teen Spirit' evening at the Wakefield Theatre Royal. Also, all the very best to all the pupils and staff who are involved in the Rhine Valley music tour, next week.
