Pupils and families will no doubt get to meet both new staff to the school and new subject teachers as we work through the year.

Uniform: Thank you to families for their support with pupil uniform. The pupils look smart and this helps the school in establishing high expectations and a strong sense of community.

New Reception Area: Over the summer break we opened up a new visitor reception area, which is the first building you can access when entering the site. Please report here when you need to come into school. Staff here will then 'sign' you in and get you to the location, or person, you need to see.

Edulink: By now parents of Year 7 pupils should have received their logon details to EduLink. EduLink allows parents to look at attendance, achievement, and behaviour records as well as viewing pupil timetables etc. EduLink one also allows you to report absences for your child. EduLink can be accessed by going to www.edulinkone.com or by downloading the EduLink One app from the app store on your phone.

Site Security: You may well have noticed that the school now has a full perimeter fence and electronic gates. The gates will be locked from 8.45am - 3.00pm. This is to ensure the safety and wellbeing of pupils, staff and visitors.

Parking: There are limited parking spaces next to the school reception area for visitors to school. These can be accessed at all times and are not locked or fenced off.

The 3G parking area is for staff only and/or for visitors who have business in the school. Please avoid dropping off/picking up in this area as this prevents staff getting into school to start their day's work.

School Streets: From Thursday 30 September, Kettlethorpe Hall Drive will be closed in the morning before school and again when the pupils leave at the end of the day. This is being introduced by the council to protect and safeguard our pupils. The road will be blocked off.

The council have introduced a 'Park and Stride' initiative to encourage families to drop off their children away from school so that the pupils can then walk in with their friends and family. This will assist in reducing the car congestion issues that we often have, especially at the end of the day.

As families, do please discuss how these changes will impact on your child's journey to school.
