## 1 - VOCABULARY

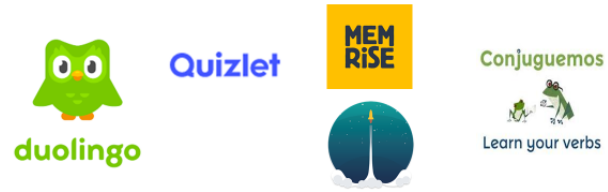
Vocabulary learning is most effective when done on a little and often basis.

- Use your knowledge organisers to revise current topics or review older ones.

## 3 – And more VOCABULARY!

When you are introduced to a new word, learn other words from the same word family (verb, adjective, noun, etc.) or learn other words that are related.



## 4 – Technology



Switch your phone, games console, tablet and Apps into the target language.

## 5 – Repetition

Cover your house in the kitchen. notes. For example, label items in the kitchen. Repetition and familiarity build confidence.



## 6 – YOU TUBE

You Tube has a huge range of children's TV programmes in many different languages. The language is often simple, repetitive and high frequency.



You will understand much more than you expected to!

## 7 – Become the teacher

Teaching a family member can be a fun way to practice the language and gain in confidence.



## 8 – Watch films in the target language



You may not understand it all but you will recognise some words and phrases - and there are some excellent films to watch!

## 9 – Tune into the radio or podcasts

Through the **tunein** App, you can access lots of foreign radio stations. Have a listen while you are doing the washing up or tidying your room! Thanks to podcasts, you can learn languages on demand. You can also find Duolingo Podcast on Spotify and listen to stories in the target language.



## 10 – Do your homework!

Spend sufficient time on your homework and complete more than the minimum.

Ensure that your work is well-presented and is something that you are proud of.
