Dear Parent/Carer and Pupils

We are now getting towards the end of a very busy and successful autumn term. A number of individual pupils raised sums of money that were well into the hundreds. Particular mention to Travis Clark and Yasmin Coe who between them raised £880 with their cake bake. Also, Adam Bernardo, who raised £390 by running 10K, every day, for a week. Well done to everyone for their support this year. The school's running total for fundraising over the last ten years is now in excess of £110000.
