Dear Parent/Carer and Pupils

Following the recent return to school for the new academic year, we are pleased to report that the pupils really have made an excellent start. They look impressive in their uniforms and are going about their learning with a sense of purpose. Very well done everyone, and be sure to enjoy the year in school.

Welcome also to the new Year 7, all 355 of them, who have already shown themselves to be a keen and enthusiastic year group. They had a super team building day at 'Mission Out', in Tingley, last week that also built on a very successful summer school in August. To all our Year 7's do get involved in the life of the school, be kind and be sure to get into school every day. Enjoy your first year at the school.

GCSE Results: The results this summer were amongst the best ever for the school and certainly reflected the hard work and focus of our 320 Year 11 pupils, their families and staff in school. There were some exceptional individual performances both in terms of getting the highest grades, as well as importantly, pupils achieving personal bests against their target grades.

Once again, the school's English Baccalaureate (EBacc) results were the best across the Wakefield district both for percentage of entries (77%) as well as at 4+ (43%) and 5+ (31%). This has now been the case for the last four years and represents GCSE passes across English, mathematics, Modern Foreign Languages (MFL), science and a humanity entry per pupil. In terms of the overall EBacc entry at 77%, this will certainly be amongst the highest entries for any school across the North of England.

In terms of combined English/mathematics passes, these were 73% for 4+ passes, 57% for 5+ passes and 20% for 7+. Again, some impressive outcomes and results that pupils can be proud of as they move onto college or employment.

Very well done to all our ex-Year 11 pupils and we wish you every success going forward. We very much look forward to seeing you at the school's presentation evening on Thursday 16 November where our guest for the evening will be Stuart Pearce, the ex-England international football player.

Pupil Behaviours: Over the year, the school will record positive pupil behaviours and this will then lead to recognition through a number of rewards. - The possession of any illegal substance will always lead to permanent exclusion from our school community.
- Pupils who are unkind, rude or disrespectful to others, or cause disruption to learning, will run the risk of suspension/removal from school.
- Pupil behaviour on public buses, at Asda and across the local community matters, and pupils who fail to behave as expected or cause a nuisance or disruption run the risk of removal from the school community.

As a large school community, every child and adult should be allowed to go about their business without worry. As already mentioned, the vast majority of our pupil body get it right all the time. The points above have been made explicit so that everyone is very clear about what consequences can come into play.
