Analysis of an unseen poem followed by a short comparison with an additional unseen poem.

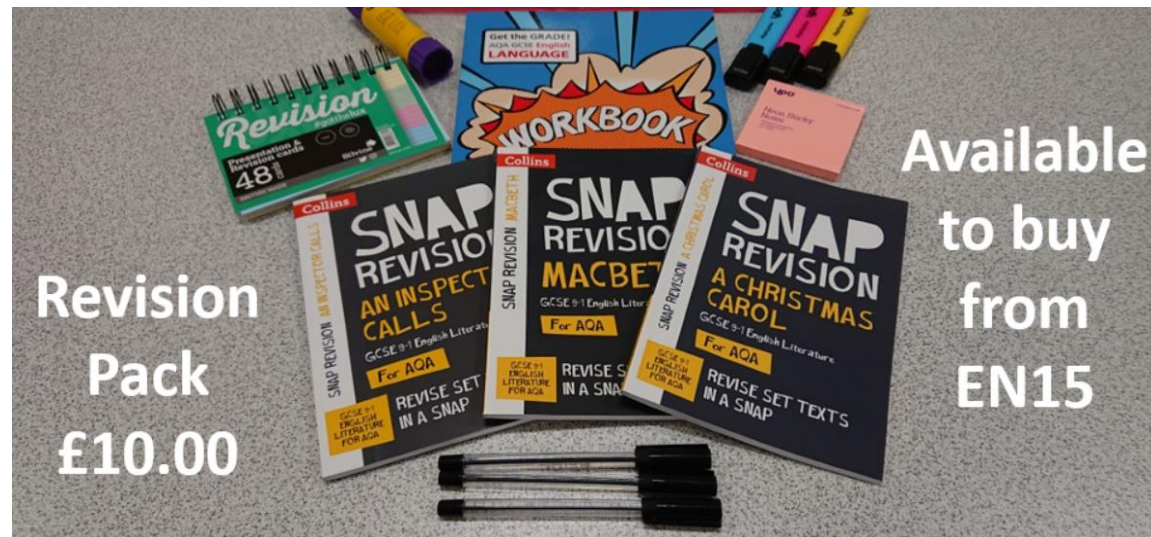
