Introduction

This strategy booklet is to be used alongside your Knowledge Organiser exercise book, to help you develop your revision techniques.

Retrieval practice is a powerful tool for improving learning. Through the act of retrieval, or calling information to mind, our memory for that information is strengthened and forgetting is less likely to occur.

There are 20 strategies that you can try for your revision. Have a go at each one and see which one suits your individual needs. You may like some strategies more than others and may want to use it again and again for different subjects.

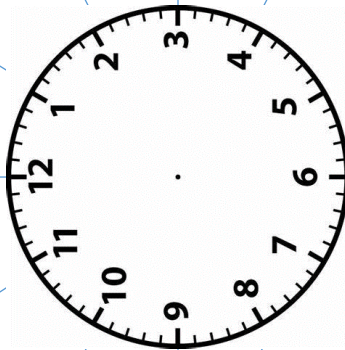
