Dear Parent/Carer and Pupils

It has been really nice getting to and from school with the longer days and also the occasional sunny day too!

A lot has been happening in school and the staff and pupil body have been working hard. A lot has been done over the 5-week half-term in school.

Information from our Attendance Team:

Punctuality: As per school policy, each week parents will receive a notification (by text) informing them if their child has been late on two or more occasions. This message can be replied to via text. Please be aware, this shares both **morning and afternoon** register marks so may be up to 10 occasions. Whilst we are aware buses and traffic may sometimes be a problem, detentions will be issued for persistent lateness. We thank you in anticipation of your support.

Sporting News: It has been a busy time for pupils who have been involved in a wide range of sporting events recently.

Year 10 Boys' Football: The team won the Wakefield Cup beating Outwood Freeston 3-1 in the final. An excellent team effort captained by Harvey Roberts. Harry Bolland was named as 'Man of the Match'. They are also currently the Wakefield League winners as well.

Swimming: Beth Warner (Year 8) took gold in her 3 individual races along with 3 golds at the ESSA Inter-Division Championships. She also achieved an ESSA Junior girls' record in the 200m free event.
