Keep Up, Catch Up Curriculum

We are pleased to be able to launch our brand new online 'Keep Up, Catch Up Curriculum' for pupils at Kettlethorpe High School. This is an online directory of lessons and resources carefully matched to the sequence of learning taking place in classrooms throughout the school year. We encourage all pupils to access these resources when absent from school or a specific lesson, or to catch up on any previously missed learning or areas of continued difficulty. The resources can be used as a revision tool & also for any end of unit tests. Pupils will just need to log in using their school username and password and click the relevant link. You may also find, as parents/carers, having this overview of learning across Y7 to Y11 useful to inform discussions about learning taking place in school. In recent surveys at Y7 and Y9 Settling in Evenings, feedback suggested we could provide more guidance on what children are covering, and when, within lessons; we hope that this is also useful for supporting with this.

Educational Visits


Outdoor Pursuits

Year 9 Netball won 13-10 against Woodkirk on 21 October - POM - Daisy N.


Year 10 netball won against Woodkirk also on 21 October - 7-4 - POM - Ava G.
